Historical Sketch

Raymond Stanley Lantz was born December 2, 1917, in Eau Claire, Wisconsin, a son of Rev. Raymond S. Lantz and Marguerite Cochran Lantz.

While a freshman at Illinois Wesleyan University, in 1935, he began working part time for radio station WJBC in its studio on the Wesleyan campus. He worked for WJBC, eventually becoming

program Director, until entering the Army in 1944. He was sent to the Philippines in 1945 and returned to the United States in 1946. In 1947 he began work as a reporter at the *Pantagraph*. He became Assistant to the Farm Editor in 1954 and was named Farm Editor in 1960. He retired in 1976. He served on the Board of Directors of Brokaw, then BroMenn Hospital from 1971 to 1987.

In 1941 he married Evelyn Cornelius. They had one daughter, Rebekah Christine, born June 26, 1957.

Lantz died April 4, 2004.

Scope and Content Note

The collection materials consist of Lantz's memorabilia, photographs and booklets from his Army service in the South Pacific, memorabilia from his work at WJBC, and at the *Pantagraph*, and samples of the articles he wrote and topics he covered. Also included are materials he collected about Adlai Stevenson, about Brokaw/BroMenn hospital during Lantz's service on its Board of Directors, 1971- 1987, and about East Bay camp and its founder and early director, Rev. Frank L. Breen.

Clippings of articles from the *Pantagraph* with details and many local photographs of memorial activities and funerals. Includes programs from memorial services at Illinois State University and the Unitarian Church.

Folder 31: Adlai Stevenson – Bloomington/Normal Connections

Clippings of articles from the *Pantagraph* about Stevenson's family, life, and activities in Bloomington, Normal and McLean County. Includes the August 1, 1965 issue of *The Family Circle, issued for and by members of the Daily Pantagraph*.

Includes articles and other materials about the Stevenson stamp, his Cabinet Chair, reproductions of a woodcut of Stevenson offered to Illinois public schools, a living memorial proposed by Lyndon Johnson, the Stevenson Expressway, Illinois State University's Stevenson Hall, and a bronze bust of Stevenson by W. Douglas Hartley.
