Brief History

Many subscription schools were begun by early settlers, with parents paying a set amount for each child. In 1825, the state legislature passed a law to create free schools. The public objected to taxing for this purpose, and the tax provision was repealed two years later.

After 1837, a state school fund was created by interest on the sale of public lands and distributed to schools based on pupil attendance per teacher schedules. Interest from the sale of the sixteenth section and income from the sixteenth section comprised the Township School Fund. Local taxation of real estate was also allowed to support schools if approved by local voters. Typically, these taxes met only part of the financial need and personal contributions were also required. Many schoolhouses were thus also used for church and community meeting places.

The Illinois Free School Law of 1855 allowed township to organize school districts with elected boards of directors which could levy taxes for buildings and teacher salaries. New school buildings soon dotted the entire county. Additional changes in state funding ensued in coming years.

Originally district numbers were assigned within townships. In 1902, all districts were renumbered on a county-wide basis.
